Issue

Create a policy for client computers to scan with strict cleaning enabled

Configure client computers to automatically remove Potentially Unwanted Applications (PUAs)

Solution

If you do not use ESET Remote Administrator to manage your network

Perform these steps on individual client workstations.

Edit policy settings for clients in ESET Remote Administrator

- 1. Open ESET Remote Administrator Web Console (ERA Web Console) in your web browser and log in. <u>Open ERA Web Console</u>.
- 2. Click **Admin** \Join \rightarrow **Policies**, select the policy for the clients on which you want to remove PUAs and then click **Edit**.

3. Expand Settings, click Antivirus, expand Basic and then click the slider bar next to Enable detection of potentially unwanted applications, Enable detection of potentially unsafe applications and Enable detection of suspicious applications to select which of these application types you want to remove.

 Click Antivirus → On-demand computer scan, expand Basic and then select In-depth scan from the Selected profile drop-down menu.

- 5. Expand **ThreatSense Parameters** and select **Strict cleaning** from the **Cleaning level** drop-down menu.
- 6. Click **Finish**. Your client computers will receive the policy updates the next time they check in to ESET Remote Administrator.

Edit scan profile settings on individual client workstations

1. Open ESET Endpoint Security or Endpoint Antivirus. <u>Open my ESET</u> <u>product</u>.

- 2. Press the **F5** key to access Advanced setup.
- 3. Click **Antivirus** and expand **Basic**. Click the slider bar next to the application types you want to remove: **Enable detection of potentially unwanted applications**, **Enable detection of potentially unsafe applications**and **Enable detection of suspicious applications**.

4. Click **On-demand computer scan**, expand **Basic** and select **Indepth scan** from the **Selected profile** drop-down menu.
