1. [Open ESET Security Management Center Web Console](#) (ESMC Web Console) in your web browser and log in.
2. Click **Policies** and then select the policy that you want to modify.
3. Click **Policies** → **Edit**.

4. Click **Settings**. If you have selected to create a **New** Policy in the previous step, select **ESET Endpoint for Windows** from the drop-down menu.

5. Click **User Interface**, expand **Access Setup**, and then click the slider bar next to **Password protect settings**(select the option based on your Endpoint version: 6 and below or 7 and above).
