A new version has been released

Version 6 of ESET Remote Administrator (ERA) and ESET business products were released in North America December 11th, 2014, and globally February 25th, 2015. Push install from administrator account

The account under which the remote installation is performed must be an account with administrator rights or, preferably, a domain administrator account. Values inserted in the **Default Logon** window are reset after each service (ERAS) restart.

I. Set the Default Logon for Email and Logon Script Installations

II. Enable the Use server default logon also by push installation option

1. Open the ESET Remote Administrator Console (ERAC) by clicking **Start** → **All Programs** → **ESET** → **ESET Remote Administrator Console** → **ESET Remote Administrator Console**.

2. Click **Tools** → **Server Options**.

3. Click the **Advanced** tab → **Edit Advanced Settings**.

4. Expand **Remote Administrator** → **ERA Server** → **Settings** → **Advanced**.

5. Click **Use server default logon also by push installation**, select the check box next to **Yes / No** and then click **Console** → **Yes** to save your changes. The the logon information that has been predefined for logon scripts, email remote installations and remote push installations (in part I of this article) will automatically be used for subsequent push installations.
